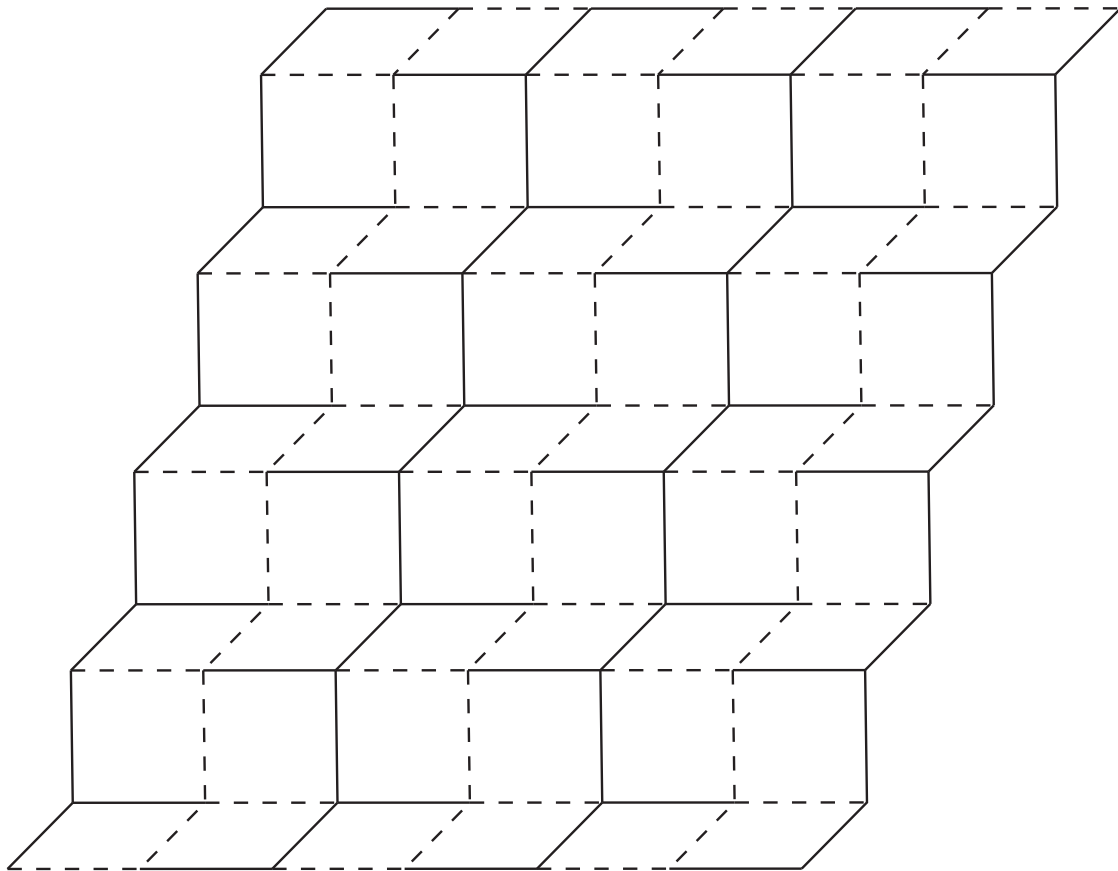




Escher Cube Tessellation

Print and Score

Print this page out, cut! around the shape and then score along the valleys from the top, turn over, and score the mountains from underneath. An old inkless ballpoint pen is a great tool for scoring paper.

Fold

This crease pattern creates cube like shapes that emerge when you compress it horizontally.
